BRUC Elections Process

Part 1: Leaders (*Ministry of Elder*) and Presbytery Representatives

A Congregational Meeting has been called on **21st April 2024** at our Blacktown Centre, 2.30pm to present recommendations from the Church Council regarding the election processes.

Following a Special Church Council Meeting held **7th April 2024**, amongst other outcomes the Church Council agreed to the following,

- * To recommend that the Congregation adopt the change in names of Elders and Pastoral Leaders to “Leader (Ministry of Elder)”.**
- * That the Congregation adopt the BRUC Guidelines and Requirements for Leader (Ministry of Elder) Document.**

God's Mission Call

Where to from here? Stage 2

Four working parties will be formed for each of the four key themes arrived at by the end of thematic analysis of the stories, leaf prayers and tablecloth dreams. These are:

1. "Keeping our Eye on God": Discipleship and Worship

This working group will focus on things like how to keep "growing disciples", "nurturing our relationship with God" and learning more about Jesus and God's Word as well as on strategies for worship.

2. Being a Caring, Connected, Welcoming, Inclusive Church Community

This working group will focus on developing strategies which foster an inclusive, welcoming community; strategies which promote connection and unity and strengthen relationships within the church as well as activities which care for others within the church community and for the church.

3. Living out Discipleship in the Community

This working group will focus on identifying specific community projects which BRUC might focus on and what might be involved in those projects.

4. "Growing Young": Bringing Children and Young People to the Church

This working group will focus on developing strategies for bringing more children and young people to the church and projects for working with children or young people.

Our hope is that everyone in the congregation who is able, will join one or more of the working groups. Those who are not able can offer their support in prayer. These groups will determine the “what” and “how” of the way ahead.

We look forward to continuing together to explore God’s love and mission for Blacktown Regional Uniting Church and the wider community, and we leave you with three inspiring prayers and dreams which cut across multiple themes and offer a rich vision for the future of our church.

“That the church is vibrant and alive and grows and represents a point of difference in our world for all to see.”
